6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Board of Studies in each department meets once in two year to discuss the necessary changes in curriculum. The changes in curriculum are made to keep pace with the changes in technology and the current expectation of job market.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Both conventional and innovative methods of teaching are in practice

- Black board teaching, assignments, seminar and group discussions
- Interactive white board display board installed in many departments
- Laptop use by students and staff in class room teaching
- LCD projectors are installed in each department for innovative teaching
- Experiential learning through field/industrial visit

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The question setting and valuation of internal exams are done by the concerned class teachers
- External Question paper setting and Central valuation by external examiners are in practice for all UG and PG programmes.
- Results are published within 30 days from the date of the last exam. Supplementary exam is conducted for final year students who have not cleared up to two papers.

**ICT** One class room was converted into a Smart classroom equipped with AV aids. Every department has been provided LCD projector. A multimedia language lab, computer labs provide opportunities for hands-on training to students.

**Infrastructure** In order to ensure safety and security of the campus community, the college is under central surveillance with the installation of CCTVs at several locations in the campus. Fire extinguishers have been installed.
